n our Fall Update, we shared with you about the 3rd pillar of Youth Unlimited's mission, Safe Communities, and how we are working to create safe spaces for teens in Edmonton. Now, over the past few months, we've had a lot of discussions with our YUE team surrounding the 4th pillar of our youth care: Opportunities to Give Back. Our mission at YUE is to invest in the lives of youth by providing Holistic Care, Mentoring Relationships, Safe Communities and Opportunities to Give Back. That last pillar -Giving Back- is the cornerstone of the work we do. As teens in our programs come to find a sense of belonging, discover who they are and experience the richness of community, our desire is for them to start recognizing their gifts

and begin to use them to help others, just as they've been helped. By teaching youth to give back we envision not just transformation of young lives but transformation of our community. We hope that as you read these stories about the importance of giving back, you will see how valuable your giving has been in enabling teens to serve those in need and help give life to others.

"Do they not want to serve? Are they apathetic? Does our culture cause us to be so selfabsorbed that teenagers care more about themselves than others? Or...are we just not giving them opportunities to give back?"

At The Cellar Youth Centre, we've noticed an increase in the number of kids who are showing leadership ability and initiative. This last year has been an exciting season

At Stepping Stones a couple weeks ago we had the opportunity to have a volunteer come in and teach some of our young moms how to crochet. She spent an hour and a half with us teaching the moms some basic stitches and even sent them home with some yarn and a hook so they could continue practicing on their own! The moms loved learning and are excited to use their skills in the future.

Giving back is something that we find very important within Youth Unlimited as a whole, and within Stepping Stones it is just as important. We'd like to bring back our volunteer, now that the girls have a basic understanding of the simple stitches, and have her teach the young moms how to crochet little hats. The moms in turn would like to take the hats that they make and donate them to a local NICU in Edmonton so that the babies born who have to spend time in the NICU will have a cute hat to wear and take home.



Some of our moms personally have had a child stay in the NICU but the common denominator is that they're all moms. They all have children and know how hard it can be at the beginning. A gesture like this allows a mom to feel that someone cares about her and her baby. It may be small but it is important nonetheless. We can't wait to be able to donate some hats to a local NICU and give back to our community!

"Basically Babies" is a charity that works to provide for the basic needs of newborn babies born to families in extreme need in the greater Edmonton area. They provide an entire year's supply of things like clothing, outerwear, storybooks, sleepers, footwear, etc. YUE's Stepping Stones program recently got in touch with Basically Babies and will be a recipient organization. This means that the young mom's that Stepping Stones works with will be receiving Layettes that our Strong Leaders group at the Cellar help to organize and put together. How neat is that?!

We're excited to see how God will continue to work in the lives of our students. We're even more excited to see how He'll work through them as they become stronger leaders and give back to their families, friends, schools, and communities.
